- 1) Program targets adolescent girls, ages 14 to 18, enrolled at Freedom High School (Albuquerque Public Schools) and Independence High School (Rio Rancho Schools), and girls attending New Vision Quest Alternative Middle School, ages 12-14, who are at-risk for abuse, neglect, and exploitation, substance use, school dropout or are pregnant or parenting.
- 2) The six (6) week "Heads Up!" child abuse prevention curriculum, two hours per session, will be provided twice during the school year at each of the above named schools, to sixty young women. The curriculum will enhance the potential victim's ability to protect herself, through empowerment, planning and learning to recognize and respond to possible danger.

Present/deliver "Abilities In Action" curricula to 10 caregivers/parents.

- 1) Administer pre test to the 10 caregivers/parents before the beginning of six modules and post test to the same 10 caregivers/parents after six modules in order to measure their entry and exit knowledge of sexual violence.
- 2) Complete and document qualitative aspects of the presentation of "Abilities In Action" after each module. Agency and Contractor staff will develop form that will document qualitative information.

- B. Maintain contact with various elementary, middle and high schools special education teachers and school counselors for sites for future presentations and applications of “Abilities In Action” curriculum.
- C. Formalize the search for the two schools targeted for Pilot of completed curriculum.

- 1) Services for a target population of runaway, homeless and street youth who are experiencing or are at risk for abuse, neglect, and exploitation and are living on the streets of Santa Fe.
- 2) Implement the FIRST CONTACT STREET OUTREACH program in order to meet the basic health and safety needs of street youth through the following street and/or center based activities; distribution of food, health and hygiene supplies, clothing, and *Resource Guide* books, and implement the Street Smart curriculum to reduce substance use and unprotected sexual behavior in the target population;
- 3) Provide the Resource Center facility in downtown Santa Fe, where the target population youth can shower, do laundry, have a hot meal, talk with

program staff, connect with resources, and rest.

- 4) Provide case management and life skills training to youth; provide family communication and reunification services, including transportation, such as bus or airplane tickets home, free phone calls, e-mails, and facilitating contacts with family members as needed.
- 5) Community education and collaboration as a primary prevention activity:
 - Raise community awareness of the needs of homeless, runaway and street youth through presentations;
 - Liaison activities with city, county and state government agencies;
 - Collaborate with churches, medical providers and others to serve the target population.

Program Description:

- Identify pregnant women who are using drugs
- Identify mothers of newborn children who have been drug-exposed before birth
- Develop an integrated community network. The network will include service agencies and interested community members who will share information regularly, make referrals to the project and provide related services if needed.
- Engage Eastern New Mexico Medical Center, Maternal Child Health, REACH 2000, Eastern New Mexico University-Roswell, and the Roswell Police Department to broaden and strengthen the community effort to get young children who have been exposed in utero to drugs and the families into supportive services.
- Provide a continuum of interdisciplinary services to identified children and families that integrates health care; developmental assessment and intervention; service coordination; parenting skills, counseling and support groups.
- Administer a multidisciplinary developmental evaluation in order to determine eligibility for early intervention services. A developmental specialist will use the Hawaii Early Learning Profile (HELP) to assess overall development and the Environmental Risk Assessment (ERA) to identify risk factors related to the child's basic needs, family support and home structure. Depending on other presenting developmental concerns, a physical, occupational or speech therapist may administer a specialized tool.
- Develop an Individualized Family Service Plan detailing desired outcomes, objectives, strategies, and type and method of services (such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and direct instruction) for each family served.

- Provide Early Intervention services that will focus on strengthening parents' capacity to build positive relationships with and nurture development of their children. Services include direct instruction (showing parent/caregiver strategies to support the child's development), family education and hands-on intervention. Physical, occupational and/or speech therapy may be provided based on need. Service coordination will also be provided to link the family to community resources. All services will be provided in the setting of the family's choice, including the home.
- Provide parenting skills training, counseling and support groups to identified parents to include:
 - A. A developmental specialist will offer 1.5 hour parenting skills sessions once a week for the duration of the project.
 - B. Parent skills training will focus on strengthening family capacity in the areas identified by the ERA and fostering parental protective behaviors for their children.
 - C. A licensed counselor/social worker will facilitate a 1.5-hour support group once a week, focusing on the common challenges of parenthood and substance abuse. Licensed counselor/social worker will also be available to provide individual substance abuse counseling to mothers
